**Subject: York Water Company Supply Events**

## **Purpose**

To establish a standard dispatch and notification guideline for incidents directly impacting York County's water supply.

## Standard

When a call is received advising there has been an incident involving the East or South Branch of the Codorus, and the dispatcher is then advised of an event that will have an adverse effect on the water supply, the 9-1-1 dispatcher should proceed as follows.

- 1. Dispatch Emergency Crews as per the firebox card and 9-1-1 protocols to respond. Use the Hazmat assignment.
- 2. Notify York Water Company via the Water Company vadon in the CML.
- 3. The Water Company dispatcher will notify a water company representative to respond to the incident
- 4. Notify County EMA personnel, PEMA, DEP, and the Fish Commission.

The following municipalities have a portion of the East or South Branch of the Codorus running thru them. This list is a guide to help differentiate branches of the Codorus. The East and South Branch both eventually run into the streams and lakes that supply York County's water system. The West Branch does not:
